Myponga Reservoir Walking Trail

Hansen Street, Myponga

The 3.3km (approx.) loop track on the south east side of the reservoir takes you through open plains, forested areas and native vegetation. The unsealed trail is suitable for walking, running and cycling and has several picnic tables along the way. You're also welcome to pack a picnic blanket or chairs, find a spot, sit back, relax and enjoy the view!

Yankalilla Skate Park

180 Main South Road, Yankalilla

This one's for the whole family! The park offers an active and fun day out, it has a large skate park, perfect for anyone with bikes, skateboards, scooters or roller skates. There is also an 'access for all' designed playground, a BMX trail, mini basketball court and an outdoor gym. The wheelchair friendly park has picnic/barbecue facilities, tables and chairs, and seating along the skate park to watch all the action. The park also has toilets and a fully fenced play area.

The beautiful spot in the Conservation Park has picnic tables and a beautiful Stringybark forest short walk to finish off your picnic.



Hay Flat Road, Hay Flat

Ingalalla Waterfalls are in the Second Valley Forest, 10 kilometres south of Normanville on Hay Flat Road.
The Waterfalls are located within 500 metres of the car park. With recent autumn rains the falls are flowing and are spectactular. It's a beautiful spot for a picnic, some bird watching and just some good old R&R! Picnic tables available here.

Nature Playground

Main South Road, Myponga

Talisker Conservation Park

Bungala Park

The beautiful spot in the Conservation Park has picnic tables and a beautiful Stringybark forest short walk to finish off your picnic.

HMAS Hobart Lookout

7241 Main South Rd, Normanville

Five kilometres south of historic Normanville is beautiful 'Lady Bay'. Not officially named a town, it is the colloquial title given to a settlement of shacks built half a century ago. A long stretch of Norfolk pine trees separates the coast from land providing many choices of picnic spots. Where the road leaves the coast and heads into a gorge you will find a lookout with a memorial to the ex-HMAS Hobart that was scuttled offshore. Here you will find bench seating and a spectacular view.

Myponga Reservoir Lookout

736 Reservoir Road, Myponga

The Myponga Reservoir Lookout provides sweeping views of the reservoir and surrounding pine forest. Construction of the reservoir began in 1957 and it was completed in 1962. The concrete arch dam wall is 49 metres high and 226 long. The reservoir is 35 metres deep and holds 26,800 mega litres.
